

WHAT MORE CAN WE DO?

Ask your teacher if you can do any of these projects below to help wildlife at home or at school

- **Our garbage and litter can kill animals.** We can reduce the amount of single use plastics we use by bringing “nude” lunches to school. Research what kinds of foods you could bring in your lunch and how to wrap them if needed.
- **Help keep our environment safe and clean for our animals.** Clean up litter from an area, such as your school, a local park, creeks, or beach and make sure it's put into the correct bins.
- **Help protect native animals from dehydration in drought, and heatwaves.** Put water bowls out for your local wildlife and make sure they have sticks or rocks in them to help small animals climb in and out.
- **Create a wildlife habitat on your school grounds or at home.** These provide food and shelter for our native animals. Choose native and animal friendly plants that attract birds and insects and don't forget places for small animals to hide.
- **Introduced predators, such as cats, can really hurt our wildlife.** Research ways people can be responsible cat owners and then help educate the school community with posters, flyers / pamphlets or articles for the school or local newsletters.
