## COVID Safe Excursions

*June 2021*

Moonlit Sanctuary is following our COVID Safe plan in accordance with Victorian Government regulations. We are endeavouring to keep our staff and all our visitors safe with the following measures.

We appreciate the cooperation of schools to ensure we can abide by these regulations.

### **Moonlit Sanctuary responsibilities:**

- Surfaces are sanitised in between use by different schools (daily)
- Provision of hand sanitiser upon entry to Moonlit Sanctuary
- Schools have exclusive use of education zones.
- All Moonlit Sanctuary staff will wear masks when required by the most current Department of Health guidelines.
- If masks are currently mandated by the Department of Health, Moonlit Sanctuary Education officers may remove their own masks when speaking to students during an educational session to ensure effective communication.

### **School responsibilities:**

#### **Contact Tracing**

Moonlit Sanctuary understands that the excursion contact person is to be informed if any contact tracing is required. Schools should complete a DET *Attendance form for contact-tracing* and provide this to Moonlit Sanctuary either via email to [education@moonlitsanctuary.com.au](mailto:education@moonlitsanctuary.com.au) or a hard copy given to education staff on the day.

#### **Masks**

All adults and secondary students should wear masks when required by the most current government regulations. Teachers may remove masks to ensure effective communication in areas that they do not interact with the general public and Moonlit staff.

#### **Social Distancing**

All supervising adults and Moonlit education staff will endeavour to minimise mixing between school groups and the general public by maintaining appropriate social distance during guided tours.

#### **Parent Helpers**

We allow parent helpers at the usual ratios. Schools are not required to bring this number of parent helpers if they feel they may effectively supervise students without their assistance. Your own school policies will govern how you arrange these measures.
