

## EXCURSION CODE OF CONDUCT

As an intimately sized Wildlife Park with free-roaming animals, visitors are privileged to experience closer proximity to native Australian Animals than is possible in other facilities.

It is essential all Teachers, supervising adults and students understand the importance of the following expectations.

### Supervising Teachers are responsible for:

- ✓ Closely supervising students in their care **at all times** and modelling appropriate behaviours – including when Education Officers are conducting sessions.
- ✓ Ensuring students maintain behaviours that prevent stress to all our animals. Loud noises, running, chasing animals, climbing, digging, throwing stones, and carrying sticks are not appropriate behaviours in this setting.
- ✓ Ensuring students move around the park in a way that maintains appropriate use of spaces shared with other visitors. Be especially conscious of sharing space, and volume during Keeper Presentations.
- ✓ Communicating the **Code of Conduct** to all Teachers, supervising adults, and students.

### Students are responsible for:

- ✓ Behaving in a way that shows respect and care for all animals.
- ✓ Moving in a way that maintains their own safety and the safety of others.
- ✓ Treating each other, Teachers, and staff at Moonlit Sanctuary with respect - allowing all classmates to benefit from the learning experience.
- ✓ Treating all property of Moonlit Sanctuary and of all visitors with respect.
- ✓ Following the instructions of Staff, Education Officers, and Teachers.

**Moonlit Sanctuary has the right to cease service, or ask students, classes, or schools to leave the premise, if students or teachers fail to comply with the Code of Conduct.**
